Concerns when Reintegrating

- Social implications attending courses with "traditional age" students – naiveté, disrespect
- Advising difficulties In order to be competitive with peers, many advisors recommend multiple intensive courses in the veteran's first semester
- Military/religious/political discussions in class and sharing personal views
- Less opportunity for integration due to employment/family responsibilities outside of class


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


