What is Student Engagement?

"The engagement premise is straightforward and easily understood: the more students study a subject, the more they know about it, and the more students practice and get feedback from faculty and staff members on their writing and collaborative problem solving, the deeper they come to understand what they are learning" (Kuh, 2009, p. 5).

What is Student Engagement? (continued)

Do Students Feel "Connected"?

Does their involvement address personal and professional needs:

- belonging
- self-esteem
- Individual development



Reasons Students Apply

- Asynchronous nature of curriculum
- PSU reputation
- Extent of PSU alumni base



Assumptions

- Program will develop quality classes
- Program will hire quality instructors
- Program and students will receive quality supports from WC and PSU
- Some students only want their "ticket punched"
